26. Note that the name of the mother tongue must be given even when it is the same as the language of the country in which the person was born. Thus, if a person reports that he was born in England and that his mother tongue is English, write **Eng.-English**; or if a person reports that he was born in Germany and that his mother tongue is German, write **Ger.-German**. This is necessary to distinguish such persons from others born in the same country but having a different mother tongue.
